Frequently Asked Questions

Is there a test at the end of the class?

Yes. Students are given a 150 question test at the end of the class.

Is the test difficult?

Students must achieve a passing grade of 80%. The majority of students complete the test satisfactorily.

What do I receive at the end of the class?

- a 300 page crime prevention resource book,
- a one year membership to the ISCPP,
- an ISCPP membership pin. and - if successful
- the ICPS designation which can appear after your name along with the ICPS pin.
**To maintain your designation, you must continue your membership with the ISCPP. The cost of membership each year is only \$35.*

Is this a certification class?

No, annual or bi-annual testing is required for recertification. Successful students will receive the ICPS designation from the ISCPP stating that you have demonstrated basic knowledge of crime prevention.
